

At Mission At The Cross, part of our program of discipleship and study that we partake in is the famous "Twelve Step" Life Recovery study, lead and taught on Monday nights by a team of dedicated Christian men who, over many years, have served the Lord faithfully in this calling. While organizations such as Alcoholics Anonymous, to this day, teach a "secularized" version of this curriculum that has been altered to leave concepts like "a higher power" open to interpretation and have largely written the hope and good news of the gospel out of a system of rehabilitati-

on that was originally built entirely on scriptural guidance and the hope of the good news of the gospel. Here at Mission At The Cross however, each and every man on campus knows that REAL, lasting healing only comes through Christ and the opportunity He gives us each individually to become new creatures in Him.

Sawyer) who achieved completion of the master's level certificate!
