Mr. Gardner has expressed a strong desire for your prayers for restoration, that God would work to re-establish his connections with his family, and estranged daughter, now 10, that he may be given the opportunity once again to be a positive influence on her life for the Lord. His plans for the time being are to continue to serve as a member of the team here at Hellfighters USA and to lead from the front, establishing a lasting career in sales to build a new life, renewed as a Father, Son, and Brother in Christ. After all, the race to fulfill that upward calling doesn't have its finish line set at simple sobriety and reintegration into society, but is a race run for ourselves, and for those around us, for the rest of our lives. Our prayers and support will always be behind you Tyler, and we will never stop cheering you on!
