The first time I tried cocaine, I knew that was how I wanted to feel all the time. Eventually coke and pills turned into whiskey and meth.

In absolute hopelessness, I lost my family, health and mind; meth opened up doors in the spiritual realm that allowed Satan and his demons to take up residency in my mind. The powers of darkness are so strong and euphoric, it's impossible to describe. My reality became so dark and satanic, I no longer recognized the person staring back at me in the mirror. I was spiritually dead, and out of options.

My brother heard about the Mission and my family began planting seeds, hoping I would admit I was fighting a battle I would never win in my own strength. Those seeds grew and I realized my way was not working. A few weeks later, I started my journey to the cross. On July 21, 2021, I was saved on the front porch of the Mission. James Hunt, who was also in the program, explained salvation in a way I could understand what it truly means to be saved and how much we need Jesus and that Jesus is the only way to ever make it to Heaven. We turned the crossties into an altar, I got down on my knees and prayed, and accepted Jesus as Savior.

I know God brought me to Mission At The Cross to not only fix me, but to give me the privilege of paying it forward by helping another Brother find his way to the cross. If Jesus can save me and change my life, He can change anybody. I am now Sales and Finance Manager at Hellfighters USA and plan to continue working here and encouraging the men still in the fight.
